3. Plenary session I: Procedural issues

Election of the Bureau

The Directors of the Department of Economic Affairs of the African Union Commission and the Director of the African Centre for Statistics of ECA will lead the session.

The Bureau will comprise a Chair, two Vice-Chairs and two Rapporteurs. The Bureau will serve for one year.

Adoption of the programme of work and other organizational matters

The Director of the *Institut national de la statistique* of Côte d'Ivoire will lead the session.

Under this item, the draft agenda and the draft programme of work of the Meeting will be submitted, discussed, amended (if need be) and adopted. The secretariat of the Meeting will also address any relevant administrative matters and make any announcements. A follow-up on the resolutions of the 9th CoDG will be presented by the Africa Union Commission.

4. Plenary session II: Strengthening economic statistics to support Agenda 2063 & the 2030 Agenda for SDG

This will be followed by a report on strategy for strengthening economic statistics to support Agenda 2063 & the 2030 Agenda for SDG; the report will highlight progress made and challenges faced while collecting, compiling and reporting economic statistics with a focus on the implementation of the 2008 SNA.
