TERMS OF REFERENCE

CONSULTING SERVICE TO DEVELOP AN ELECTRONIC NOTIFICATION SYSTEM FOR NON-TARIFF MEASURES

1. Background

- 1.1. The Protocol on Trade in Goods is implemented through nine Annexes. Three of these Annexes namely; Annex 5 on Non-Tariff Barriers (NTBs), Annex 6 on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) and Annex 7 on Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS) address Non-Tariff Measures (NTMs).
- 1.2. Progressive elimination of Non-Tariff Barriers (NTBs) forms a critical anchor for the implementation of the AfCFTA Agreement. The implementation of Annex 5 on NTBs is therefore being pursued within the scope of the broad objectives of this Annex, which are, amongst others build institutional structures for the elimination of NTBs, and facilitate resolution of NTBs in the AfCFTA.
- 1.3. The TBT Annex applies to standards, technical regulations, conformity assessment procedures, Accreditation and metrology. The objective is to facilitate trade through cooperation and elimination of TBTs, international best practice in regulation, use of international standards, mutual recognition arrangements and transparency.
- 1.4. Annex 7 on SPS applies to measures that directly or indirectly affect trade between State Parties. The objectives are to facilitate trade while safeguarding human, animal or plant life or health in the territory of State Parties; enhance cooperation and transparency in the development and implementation of SPS measures to ensure that they do not become unjustifiable barriers to trade; and enhance technical capacity of State Parties for the implementation and monitoring of SPS measures while encouraging the use of international standards in the elimination of barriers to trade.
- 1.5. The AfCFTA Sub-Committees on NTBs, TBT and SPS have respectively developed Work Programmes for facilitating implementation of these three Annexes. The Work Programmes were approved for implementation by the Committee on Trade in Goods and Competition.
- 1.6. The Work Programmes contain key activities that were identified and aligned with the various articles of these three Annexes. In line with the key activities, the responsibilities of the State Parties, the Sub-Committees and the AfCFTA Secretariat have also been outlined in the Work Programmes
- 1.7. The Work Programmes for the Sub-Committees on TBT and SPS respectively focus on harmonization of standards and SPS measures. In addition, both Work Programmes reference the need for TBT and SPS Notification System.
- 1.8. A study has been conducted on State Parties notification of SPS and TBT measures drawing from the WTO ePing and to this end a report has been finalized. The main objectives of the study were to explore the level of implementation of the SPS and TBT transparency obligations as obtained in the WTO SPS and TBT Agreement; investigate factors contributing to inadequate implementation of the SPS and TBT transparency obligations; and as well provide recommendations on the related transparency obligations

2. Objectives of the Assignment

2.1. To support the development of a robust notification system for facilitating and achieving transparency obligations of State Parties relating to all Non-Tariff Measures.





3. Scope of Work

The electronic notification system will consist of a comprehensive interactive platform similar to the WTO ePING that State Parties use to submit TBT and SPS notifications, submit and retrieve TBT and SPS documents on the AfCFTA implementation and access trade concerns brought to the attention of the TBT and SPS Sub Committees' attention among others. The Consultant will:

- a. Adding on to the existing research conducted, explore other digital interactive platforms that can enhance the proposed notification system.
- b. Develop, propose and demonstrate the most feasible AfCFTA notification system options/models for NTMs
- c. Establish and facilitate the operationalization of the preferred notification system
- d. Develop an AfCFTA Electronic Notification System of Non-Tariff Measures, specifically for SPS and TBT.

4. Qualifications and Experience

- 4.1. The Consultant shall have the following qualifications:
