## 1. Group work description

Group work will comprise stakeholder-specific discussions in groups, and presentations of the groups' conclusions in plenary. Representatives from Chatham House, Africa CDC and DAI will facilitate the group discussions. Groups will work on the following questions pertaining to the implementation of the feasibility plan:

1. We shared a vision for enhancing OHO. What alternative vision, or amendments to the shared vision, would you suggest to support OHO (please bear in mind that the focus is on advancing OHO in general, not on the delivery of specific OH activities)? Please describe the main outcomes of your vision.
2. With the shared vision (or yours as per question #1) in mind, what would you like to see delivered in the first 12 months? Please present the activities (these could be MoU supporting collaboration, definition of standards, evidence related developments, etc.) in a timeline.
  - a. How would you contribute to those deliverables? This could be in the form of funding, in-kind support, data, SME, etc. Please describe in as much detail as possible.

- b. How would you use those deliverables (e.g. would they inform policies, populate strategic frameworks and goals)?
- c. We want to keep momentum, and showing stakeholders commitment would increase the appeal of our plans. Please identify at least one activity on which you can start working on immediately after the workshop (ideally in partnership with other stakeholders) towards the shared/your OHO vision.
3. How would you measure progress toward OHO (please consider how routinely you would measure progress, and what data you would need to collect)?
  4. Given the large variability of OH activities, how would you group activities to enable fair comparisons?
  5. What governance structure do you suggest for the shared/your OHO vision in Eastern Africa, e.g. using existing ones, creating new ones? Please consider the different scales and stakeholders.
  6. How do we fund the implementation of the shared vision (or yours), at the different levels: region, country, communities?
    - a. Please share any possible funding opportunities for the OHO feasibility plan.
    - b. How would the shared/your OHO vision become sustainable in the long term?
  7. Local challenges will require local solutions. With this in mind, how do you foresee the implementation of the shared/your OHO vision at local levels, and the integration of these efforts with state and federal ones?
  8. What are we missing to make it happen, e.g. knowledge management expertise, project management, IT/technological developments?
  9. What training needs will be required and who are the recipients?
  10. Are there additional challenges to implementation of the shared/your OHO vision, from an organizational and technical perspective?
  11. Are there any other initiatives/opportunities (e.g. technological, organizational, social, environmental) in the horizon that could support the shared/your OHO vision?
