PAN AFRICAN CONFERENCE ON TEACHER DEVELOPMENT

INVITATION TO THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE MEDIA

- **WHAT:** Pan African Conference on Teacher Development (PACTEDIII)
- **WHEN:** PACTEDIII will be held in two phases:
 - a) Senior official meeting 16 July 2013
 - b) Ministerial meeting 17 July 2013
- WHERE: African Union headquarters, Addis Ababa

- **WHY:** As the AU celebrates the golden Jubilee, PACTED III will focus on the role of the African teachers in achieving the African educational goal. Among other issues, regional teacher qualification frameworks, teachers' mobility and qualification will be discussed.

- 3. Progress report and identify good practices in teacher development

Background:

Teacher Development is one of the major areas of focus in the Plan of action for the Second Decade of Education for Africa (2006-2015), with the goal of ensuring provision

of sufficient, well qualified and well supported teachers across Africa to facilitate quality teaching and learning. The challenge of the African teacher continues to threaten achievement of the goals of the Second Decade Plan of action, as well as EFA and MDGs.

In recognition of the central importance of teachers in the quality of education, the AU instituted the Pan African Conference on Teacher Development (PACTED) in 2011. PACTED brings together all the key agencies working on African education at the continental level, with RECs and Member States to address the perennial challenges facing teacher development in Africa in a coordinated and coherent manner.
