<u>INVITATION TO THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE MEDIA</u>

Fourteenth Ordinary General Assembly of the Organisation of African First Ladies against HIV/AIDS (OAFLA) will be held under the theme: "Enhancing partnerships to create an enabling environment to achieve: the end of AIDS by 2030 and to empower women in their Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights".
