Background: The retreat seeks to builds on AWLN vision and "Call to Action" and aims to address and develop an innovative action agenda for Africa's transformation by looking at two key pillars: advancing women's leadership and intergenerational dialogue through young women's leadership and empowerment. The retreat will consider pathways to tap into intergenerational partnerships to address strategic mechanisms for the delivery of commitments made in Africa's Agenda 2063 and the global Agenda 2030.

The objectives of the retreat include:

- 1. Role of intergenerational dialogue and mentoring in addressing the current political, social and economic affairs in the context of COVID 19 and beyond, while providing a digital space for inter-generational dialogue
- 2. Discuss strategies to strengthen young women's leadership in governance, women peace and security, global health, global health security, as well as their role as front line leaders in the Covid19 response and beyond
- 3. Launch the inter-generational AWLN mentorship program and platform
- 4. Develop short term and long-term actions steps aligned with 2021 priorities and engagements, in order to position young women in building back better through an intergenerational lens with seasoned leaders.
