Industry Intel Session at Mining Indaba 2024: "The African Green Minerals Strategy.

What: Experts and leaders will gather for the Industry Intel Session at Mining Indaba 2024 focused on "the African Green Minerals Strategy: A Game Changer for Africa's Minerals-based Industrialization". The event will also be an opportunity to launch the Assessment Reports on governance initiatives and approaches on sustainable management of mineral resources, aligning with the principles of the African Mining Vision reflecting on Morocco, Ghana, Gabon, and Zambia.

Who: The event will be addressed by among others, senior official of the African Union African Minerals Development Centre (AMDC) and AUDA-NEPAD; Government Officials with portfolios for the mining sector or natural resources from the Republics of Chad, Zambia, Nigeria, Ghana, and Uganda; and the African Development Bank; the African Legal Support Facility (ALSF); Tax Justice Network (TJNA); Global Gateway; OXFAM; OSF.
