An example of Best Practices in Landscape Approach: the Burkina Faso Sahel Integrated Lowland Ecosystem Management (SILEM)

The SILEM created and catalyzed community dynamic for the sustainable management of natural resources at micro watershed level using a landscape approach. Some results are: increased demand and mobilization for natural resources management actions, yields of cereal production increased by 23% due to improved soil fertility, enhancement of biodiversity and habitat for wildlife, and improvement of social peace between herders and farming.
