81 ASEOWA HEALTH WORKERS ARRIVE IN GUINEA

81 health workers from the Democratic Republic of Congo left Kinshasa on 26 December and arrived the same day in Guinea as part of the African Union Support mission to the Ebola Outbreak in West Africa (ASEOWA).

Prior to departure, the health workers had attended pre deployment briefings and registration, organized by the African Union Commission.

ASEOWA Head of Mission Major General Julius Oketta reported that the DRC medical personnel arrived safely and were received by the DRC Ambassador among others.
