African Union deploys joint military and civil mission against Ebola in Liberia

The first batch of 30 volunteers under its operation AU Support to Ebola Outbreak in West Africa (ASEOWA) to tackle the Ebola Virus Disease outbreak in West Africa to be deployed to Liberia have left in Addis Ababa after undergoing pre-deployment briefing at the headquarters. The team comprises epidemiologists, clinicians, public health specialists and communications personnel, the team will provide support to the Government of Liberia to tackle the Ebola Virus Disease.

Speaking to the volunteers before their departure AUC Chairperson Dr Nkosazana Dlamini Zuma lauded the courage and patriotism of the volunteers to help their fellow Africans. The volunteer experts came from Uganda, Rwanda, Democratic Republic of Congo, Nigeria and Ethiopia. The next batch of volunteers will be deployed to Sierra Leone and Guinea respectively

The Head of Mission of the AU Support to Ebola Outbreak in West Africa (ASEOWA) Dr Julius Oketta, has been received by the President of Republic of Liberia Madam Johnson Sirleaf at her office in Monrovia. She registered her heartfelt gratitude to the AUC and the AU member states who have contributed the response team, and to the international community that has responded to the AU appeal in support of the on-going response efforts by the affected member states.

The President highlighted the urgently needed activities of the ASEOWA deployment in the new treatment points to enlarge the medical response operations. In another engagement, Dr Oketta had a radio talk show with the community on what ASEOWA has come to do in Liberia and its appeal to the community to work together with the health workers to stop the spread of the Ebola virus. The reception was very good and call ins from the public were demanding for more clear messages on Ebola and the treatment procedures.
