**CAADP 10 YEARS ON:

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Objectives: During the stocktaking and consultation meeting, country, regional, continental and donor representatives will:

- Share NAIP implementation progress and challenges and identify lessons learned.
- Discuss and identify lessons from efforts to coordinate and align donor assistance to specific components of NAIPs.
- Review and discuss the 2014 areas of focus and **workstreams/thematic areas** being proposed to sustain momentum and sharpen focus on implementation efforts.
- Review and discuss areas of focus to accelerate the impact of NAIPs and investments on poverty and hunger reduction.

Expected Outputs:

Major outcomes expected from the meeting include:

- Development of **Post Business Meeting Guidelines** to support implementation of NAIPs.
- Production of a **Technical Report** that consolidates and summarizes key challenges that countries are facing and how countries are handling those challenges that directly aligns with options being proposed by the AUC and NPCA that will support country, regional and national efforts to sustain CAADP Momentum in the future.
- Summary of the review of donor coordination and support of CAADP implementation, and identification of options and actions to enhance donor engagement and support to produce **updated Guidelines for Donor Support to CAADP Process at a Country Level.**

Day 2: Donor Coordination, Harmonization and Alignment

On Day 2, the focus will shift to Donor Coordination, Harmonization and Alignment. Discussion will center on identification of what additional efforts are needed by both the donor community and the countries to improve donor coordination, harmonization and alignment. Recommendations from this session will be used to revise and update the “Joint Guidelines on Implementation and Support for CAADP” which were originally compiled in 2009 following the CAADP Donor and Partner meeting in Addis (The Addis Consensus). These newly revised Joint Guidelines will be used to accelerate the implementation of NAIPs

Day 3: SUSTAINING MOMENTUM ON CAADP IMPLEMENTATION IN THE NEXT DECADE
