

PRESS STATEMENT

PRESS STATEMENT

The Peace and Security Council of the African Union (AU), at its 326th meeting held on 26 June 2012, was briefed by theDepartment of Political Affairsof the AU and the representatives of various organizations engaged in humanitarian activities, on the situation of refugees and internally displaced persons (IDPs)in conflict situations in Africa.

Council noted with concern the humanitarian situation of the refugees, IDPs and mixed migrants, in particular women and children and other vulnerable groups, in countries in conflict. In this respect, Councilcommended the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), all organizations engaged in humanitarian activities and AUpartners, for the work done in the protection of refugees, IDPs and mixed migrants.

Councilfurther noted with satisfaction the decrease of IDPs in various African countries and stressed the need of havingwell designed post-conflict programmes, which will provide for a pragmatic and realistic development intervention to assistreturnees and prevent further displacement by stabilizing fragile societies.

Council, in line with the 1969 OAU Convention on Specific Refugees Situations in Africa, reiterated the need to locate refugee camps away from the borders.

Council urged all Member States to provide protection to refugees and IDPs, including through the development of a regional approach that facilitates information sharing and prevention of the flouting of the principle of *non-refoulment* in cases involving asylum seekers.

Council stressed that, in addition to mainstreaming the Protection of Civilians (PoC) in standard operating procedures of AUpeace support operations, PoC must form part of the mandate of future AU missions.

Council called upon the refugees, as citizens of Africa, to recognize and uphold their obligations as stated in national, regional and international legal frameworks in the spirit of our continental shared values.

Council called upon Member States that have signed the Convention for the Protection and Assistance to InternallyDisplaced Persons in Africa, to ratify the Conventionfor its early entry into force. In this regard, Council urged Member States, that havenot yet done so, to sign and ratify the Protocol, and to comply scrupulously with all relevant AU instruments governing the protection of refugees and IDPs.

Council agreed to hold, each year, an open session on refugees and IDPs in Africa.
