OPENING ADDRESS OF COMMERCE & INDUSTRY MINISTER OF INDIA

The 2nd Africa- India Forum Summit is being convened on 24th – 25th May, 2011 at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. Indian private sector entrepreneurs have made investments in excess of US \$ 25 billion in a wide range of sectors, ranging from Telecom, Automobiles, IT, Pharmaceuticals, Agriculture etc. I believe there is immense scope to take the present levels of trade and investment between India and Africa to new heights. In view of the opportunity provided by the Summit, we have organized an 'India Show', since yesterday 20th May, 2011 at Addis Ababa, which we will have an opportunity to visit later in the day. The Show will profile India's rich heritage, the story of its developmental journey and showcasing its achievements in the field of industrial development. A 'Business Conclave' will follow this meeting, in which, leading CEOs of India and Africa will take part and have an interaction with us.
