Despite the fact that meetings of the Bureau were limited due to a number of constraining factors, Zimbabwe is grateful for the support rendered by members of the bureau and their commitment to pushing the work of the STC forward.

I would also like to take this opportunity to express on behalf of the outgoing bureau and indeed on behalf of all delegates, our utmost appreciation to our dear brothers and sisters in Algeria for a very warm welcome upon our arrival and the excellent facilities that have been accorded to us for the success of our meeting. Indeed, I have no doubt that the **Government of Algeria through the Ministry of** Labour and Social Security and the Ministry of National Solidarity, Family and the Status of Women will diligently lead the incoming bureau beyond our expectation over the next vears. therefore offer two mv congratulations to Algeria for having been elected to lead the Bureau of the Second

Session of the AUSTC on social development, labour and employment.
